November Meeting

Meeting started at 6:00 PM. Secretary's and Treasurer's reports were read and accepted.

Toys For Tots distribution was discussed. Rob is looking for the contact person.

We discussed the Lease. I will update the lease and put it on the website after the meeting. We discussed putting a drawing of the field into the lease.

Kirk brought up that the Woods won't disengage the starter and one of the keys is missing. He wants to cut the grass once more this season. Todd will contact one of the Redline Racers to see about borrowing their lawnmower. Fertilizing and rolling the field was brought up. Brian McLaren volunteered his John Deere to use for this.

I will contact Stan to find out about our Non-Profit number.

We talked over winterizing the Port-a-John. It was decided nothing needed to be done.

We reviewed the carburetor replacement for the cold duck. Kirk knows someone who could provide a used one for \$60 or a new one for \$120. If we buy the used one, we will have to pay for the rebuilding it. Kirk suggested using tamper-resistant torque screws when reinstalling the carburetor to make sure this doesn't happen again. Doug and Todd made a motion to purchase the carburetor, screws and rebuild kit up to \$100.00. The motion passed.

November Meeting (Continued)

We talked about graveling the rest of the driveway. This was tabled until spring.

Todd has had 12 people reserve tables for the swap meet. We're figuring on setting up 35 tables.

We talked about the people who violated our field by walking past the fence closer to the creek and cutting across our runway. Several options were considered.

The club, for his services as instructor this year, paid Todd Litke's dues for 2004. For his lawn services and repair work, the club will cover Kirk Churchill's dues for 2004. The 4 lifetime members' cards will be mailed out before the next meeting.

Ron Pennell has soloed. Everyone should congratulate him.

Meeting ended at 7:30 and Ed London's video of our field from his airplane was viewed.

Birchwood Sports Dome Electric Fly

If you haven't checked out the guys flying at the golf dome, you don't know what you're missing.



These guys are getting hours of flying instead of sitting in the house watching TV all evening. Every other Friday night, for \$15.00 you too could be flying. Dates are Dec 19, Jan 2, Jan 16, Jan 30, Feb 13, Feb 27, Mar 12, Mar 26, Apr 9, Apr 23 from 8 PM to 11 PM.

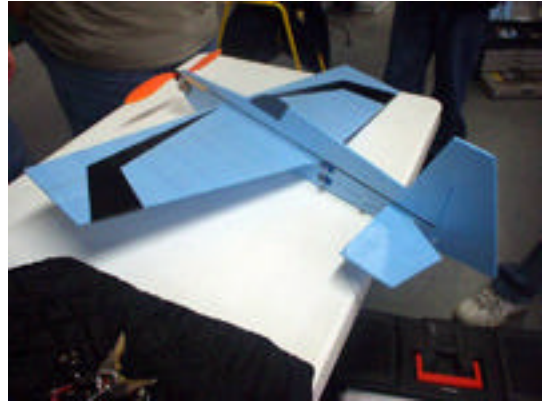
We've seen everything from planes made from insulation to helicopters to free-flight planes powered by rubber band.



Todd Litke got the plans for his Edge540 from RCGroups web site.



It's made from insulation sheets with a carbon rod added for fuselage support and held together by hot glue. It's got 3 Hitec micro HS55 servos using .35 music wire for control rods. He added half hinges for control rod support. His receiver, a \$54 DSP4SC, has a built in speed control and engine cut-out to power his GWS350C with D gearing engine and 12 x 6 slow fly prop.



To power this plane, Todd has a 12 mAH 3 cell Allerc battery. Even with no wind, Todd was still able to dazzle the crowd with his 3D flying skills.



Carl Jones was there flying his normal aircraft, a helicopter, only this ones a little smaller than the others. He was flying his MSComposite Hornet.

Ed, Josh Olszewski, and Mike Roberge were all flying scratch built planes called "And Now?" Mike has planes he got from www.flyelectric.ukgateway.net.



If you ask Ed how much his servos cost, he says "20 bucks each". He gives the same for the cost of the battery and receiver. I asked him how long it would fly on a charge and of course the answer was "20 minutes".
