Meeting started at 6:05 PM with 10 members present. Todd/Gary made a motion to accept secretary's report. Doug/Kirk made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. Both motions passed.

Rob has contacted Lynda from Toys For Tots and will be delivering the toys at 5:30 on December 11th.

Our Lease is due in February. We will vote on the new lease at the January meeting. The current document can be viewed from the web site.

The remaining field winterizing jobs that need to be done were brought up. The canopy is still up and Kirk volunteered to cover the woods.

We discussed getting a covered shed to store the tractors. Rob suggested getting a quote from Wilkerson to see what's the ballpark cost.

Kirk has access to some 2-mil chloroplast (white only). It is \$8 per sheet. Todd brought up a source he found that sells for \$7.50 per sheet.

There will be a raffle at the swap meet. One will be a 50/50. The club selected to purchase the materials to build an "And Now" electric plane to be raffled. This will be a complete RTF plane, including radio system. Todd will talk to Gary at Pastime to see about getting the complete system. Todd/Keith made a motion to spend up to \$200 on this system to be built by Ed.

Todd/Gary made motion for unanimous ballot voting since there is only 1 candidate for each office. Motion passed.

We talked about the Leader Club qualifications again. The club secretary will send pictures of the frequency board with the field rules to Rob. We must also prove the AMA safety rules are posted at the field. We still need a magazine donated to the county library.

We brought up the missing decimal meter. If anyone knows its whereabouts, please contact a club officer.

We need an information flyer for potential members about what goes on in our club.

Todd suggested drawing up a signup list for getting information about our club and having these simple forms at the swap meet.

Greg Feyers is donating some limestone for our driveway but we would have to pay for gas for the trucks. This is still tabled until spring.

The missing key to the Woods has been located.

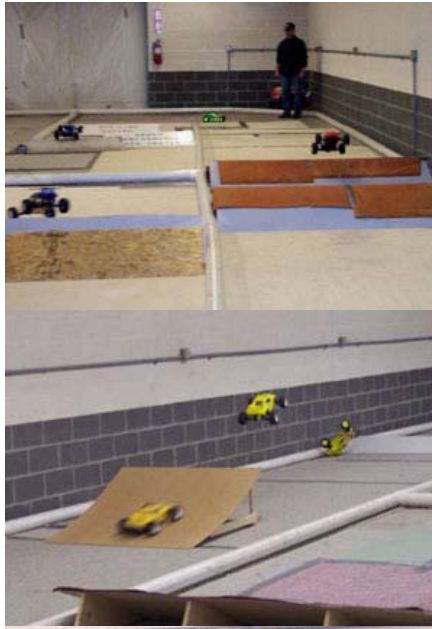
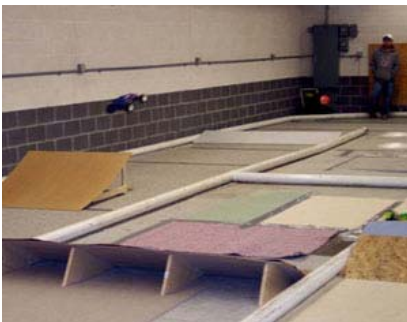
Redline Racing Team
